COMPUTER/INTERNET RESOURCE POLICY

The Colorado River Indian Tribes Library computer facilities are owned by the Colorado River Indian Tribes (CRIT), and are to be used for educational purposes only. Facilities will not be used for non-Library sanctioned commercial purposes or the installation of any non-Library software or data. The computers are not to be used to make unauthorized entry into other computational, informational or communication services or resources, or to access chatrooms, explicit websites, or E-mail accounts. Users may not distribute unsolicited advertising, invade the privacy of others, make any attempt to damage computer equipment or software, or engage in activity that is harassing or defamatory. Users are not to transmit or access threatening, obscene or harassing materials. Users may not use the Internet for any illegal activity, including violation of copyright or other rights of third parties or in a manner inconsistent with CRIT's not-for-profit status or its proper orientation. Copying, changing, renaming, or deleting files belonging to CRIT Library is against policy. Physical tampering with CRIT Library resources is not allowed. This includes adjusting computer settings and renaming files as well as the vandalism of computers and workstations. Users will not attempt to degrade system performance or to deprive authorized users of access to Library resources. Failure to comply with CRIT Library network/Internet guidelines may subject the violator to disciplinary or legal action by the Colorado River Indian Tribes.

INTERNET

To fulfill the CRIT Library's mission to promote intellectual freedom, the CRIT Library provides access to Internet resources. The use of the Internet is a privilege and not a right. Adults and children using the CRIT Library Internet terminals must show an active CRIT Library card, and sign in/out at the front lobby desk. The CRIT Library has no control over the information and assumes responsibility only for the information provided on its home page. The Internet offers access to many valuable local, national and international sources of information. However, some information found on the Internet may be inaccurate, incomplete, dated, or offensive to some individuals. The Internet terminals are to be used for educational and informational library-related research. It is intended that the use of the network will be for education and research consistent with the CRIT Library selection. Users should be aware that the Internet is not a secure medium and that third parties may be able to obtain information regarding users' activities. The CRIT Library will not release information on the use of specific Internet resources by members of the public except as required by law or necessary for the operation of the CRIT Library. The CRIT Library may log all use of the network and monitor all utilization. The CRIT Library may use blocking or filtering software to limit or deny access to Internet stations that contain information inconsistent with the educational and research goals of the CRIT Library. The CRIT Library cannot guarantee the effectiveness of filtering software, and is not responsible for any service interruptions, changes, or consequences, and can delete files at any time.

While the guidelines of a child's reading is strictly the responsibility of the parent or guardian, Juveniles ages 10-15 years old must have written permission to access the Internet. Juveniles under the age of 10 years must be under the direct supervision of a parent.

Due to limited resources available for provision of public access to the Internet, the CRIT Library has the right to set limits, such as use of large files of still or moving images or sound, or on downloading files in any medium. Users may download files to a disk; however, the user is responsible for any use agreement related to downloaded files. The CRIT Library also reserves the right to limit thirty (30) minutes per individual to a single session or the number of times an individual may access the Internet per day. Users must sign an agreement that stipulates the above policies. Parents will sign and accept responsibility for the actions of their minor children.
